Governor End of Year statement 2018-2019

Mr. Green (Chair of Governors) has published the governing body statement for the year 2018-2019, which can be found on the school website. You can also read it below:

September 2019

Dear Parents / Guardians

This letter relates to the governing body's work, decisions and focus over the 2018 / 2019 academic year.

As governors, we are adamant that the school experience for children must be an enjoyable and safe place to learn and thrive. Children who leave Colebourne are given the fundamental start needed to allow them to thrive at secondary school and onwards through life. We are under no illusion how important the best possible start is for children.

We are absolutely delighted and very proud of the achievements of the year 6 children who collectively achieved our best ever SATS results. This illustrates not only the high quality of teaching provided at Colebourne, but dedication and application from children, terrific support from parents and clear, strong leadership that has gelled together. We have also seen generally good progress across year groups.

We were subject to an OFSTED Inspection in May 2019, 4 years since our last inspection. It was a one day inspection that concluded with a report that we are very proud of. Please look at the full report that can be found on Colebourne's website for all the details.

The governing body has had to make some very difficult financial and operating decisions during 2018 / 2019. Due to the continuing financial pressures on school budgets, we needed to make some decisions in order to keep the school financially viable as well as ensuring we remain sufficiently staffed in order to provide the quality of teaching the children deserve. The major decisions were to reduce the school week to 4 and a half days, losing PPA cover and a restructure of the support staff was also carried out. It was hard and not a pleasant experience for all involved but what I can report is that the process was dignified and whilst upsetting for some, there was the appreciation of how this was done. Through the other side I am pleased to report that the new structure is working well. The governing body will continue to have a strong focus on the school budget.

Inclusivity and diversity are at the core of our values and ethos. We want everybody to have the opportunity to succeed and to be

celebrated and we welcome the breadth of activities and events that celebrates difference and community cohesion. We are proud that the school continues to be a key pillar of the Hodge Hill community. As in previous years, we ensure we are continually looking at the provision of focussed support for children who have English is an additional language (EAL) and that these children make progress. We make no apologies for keeping this on the agenda as we believe every child has the ability to thrive and progress given the right opportunities to do so.

We are also adamant that as an inclusive school there should be no difference in progress and achievement of those in receipt of free school meals (FSM) and those who aren't. I am pleased to say there is no tangible difference and this demonstrates the effectiveness of the work the staff put in to ensure that being eligible for FSM does not hamper progress and achievement at Colebourne.

Our focus and rigor around safeguarding remains a key priority and I am pleased to report, as with last year, that the Section 175 action plan is a key working document and ensures the safeguarding practices are robust at Colebourne.

The nursery – it's open! After what feels like forever, we are delighted that the nursery provision is now a real entity at Colebourne. We believe that the children coming through the nursery will have an excellent start to their education through play.

During the last year, Ms Madeeha Chaudhry was welcomed on to the Governors as LA Governor.

I am confident and hopeful of another year that sees children flourish and succeed and the Colebourne community thrive even more.
