# Y4 French Lessons at Washwood Heath Academy




4R have been going to Washwood Heath Academy every Friday to take part in French lessons taught by the secondary school teachers.

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## Challenge of the week: Science Investigation


Don't forget to have a go at the science competition. You can do this over the Easter holidays.


#### There's a bear on my Chair!


